- Huge thanks for supporting the Tough Kidder event last week. We have raised a whopping £1672 which will go towards a new outdoor learning shelter.

Summer Reading Challenge:

As we head to the summer, please try and encourage your child to read every day, no matter how old they are! Reading makes the difference.

Longton Library is open and Tom from the Library Service has sent this message:

SCART Club – our summer reading scheme for children – is back after last year's hiatus, and we hope you agree it looks great!

SCART stands for **Science**, **Culture**, **Active**, **Reading** and **Technology**, and is full of challenges and rewards for children over the course of the summer.

The challenge is to **read 5 books** as well as to **complete a task for each of the categories** (S, C, A, R and T), **earning special 'pop' badges for their reward sash** as they go and receiving their certificate if they finish the whole thing.

The pack you get when you start has all of the information you need plus **suggestions for tasks you might like to try**. If you're feeling especially creative and have an even better idea for tasks for any of the categories then no problem, we'll happily accept those too!

You can **pick up a pack from the library any time from now onwards**, with children having all the way up until the end of October to finish.

With your pack **you will also receive a ticket entitling an adult and a child to a free visit to a museum** run by Lancashire County Council between 3rd July and 12th September.

Reminders:

- <u>School Meal Arrangements</u> Thank you to those parents who informed the school office in advance of changes from school meals to packed lunches commencing September, or vice versa, it is very much appreciated. Please could I remind all our parents that at least one week's notice <u>must</u> be given to the school office to facilitate lunch changes – thank you for your co-operation!
- <u>Jewellery must not be worn at school</u>. It is important that ear-piercing is ONLY carried out at the <u>beginning</u> of the summer holidays, as earrings are <u>not</u> permitted to be worn at school. It is extremely annoying to find children returning with pierced ears and having to put plasters on during PE! Thank you for your support in this matter.
- <u>Phones</u> Please note only children in <u>Y6</u> who walk / cycle to school on their own may, if you wish, bring a phone into school. The phone is to be switched off and handed in every morning and collected at the end of the school day. Phones are not to be used in the school building or grounds. Please talk to your child about safe use of their phone and ensure you check their phone regularly and that settings are appropriate.
- <u>Green School Bags</u> are to be used by Reception, Y1 and Y2 for school, not rucksacks or other bags (space is limited). Children in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 are to try as far as possible to use their green school bags as space is limited. We ask that no bulky bags or designer handbags please. School bags are available to buy from the school office at the cost of £7.50.Thank you. No pencil cases need to be brought in from home as all the children are provided with everything they need.
- <u>All medication and inhalers</u> will be sent home on Friday. It is parent's responsibility to return any long-term medication or inhalers on Monday 6th September to the school office.
- **ParentPay** Please note that all ParentPay accounts <u>must</u> be cleared completely by the end of the summer term as debts must not be carried forward to the next academic year. Please ensure, therefore, that your child's account has a zero or positive balance. ParentPay accounts for Year 6 pupils <u>must not</u> have a negative balance by the end of term. Y6 ParentPay accounts with credit balances have been refunded. Cheques are available from the school office for collection or can be transferred to sibling accounts where possible otherwise a refund will be arranged.

Please contact the school office should you have any queries regarding this matter. Thank you for your co-operation.

- <u>Winter Uniform</u>: When we return on Monday 6th September, the children are to wear winter uniform which is the shirt and tie. Black school shoes only; no trainers. I know we have let children finish the last couple of weeks in trainers if their school did not fit but this will not be the case as we start the new year. Please label all uniform items with your child's name.
- **PE Kits:** Every child is to have their PE kit in school every week. Kits are to come to school on a Monday and be taken home every Friday for a wash. Please label all PE Kits with your child's name.
- <u>Water Bottles</u>: Every child is to have a water bottle every day in school. Water bottles with a sports top are the best as they do not spill.

September Opening:

When we return to school in September, the school gates will open at 8.40am and will close at 8.50am. Your child may arrive at any time within the 10minute window. Punctuality is an important life skill so please be on time every day.

The end of the school day will return to normal at 3.15pm and collection of your child from the playground can be from 3.15pm-3.25pm. We will be keeping the same dismissal procedure as this year i.e. each class will line up on the playground.
